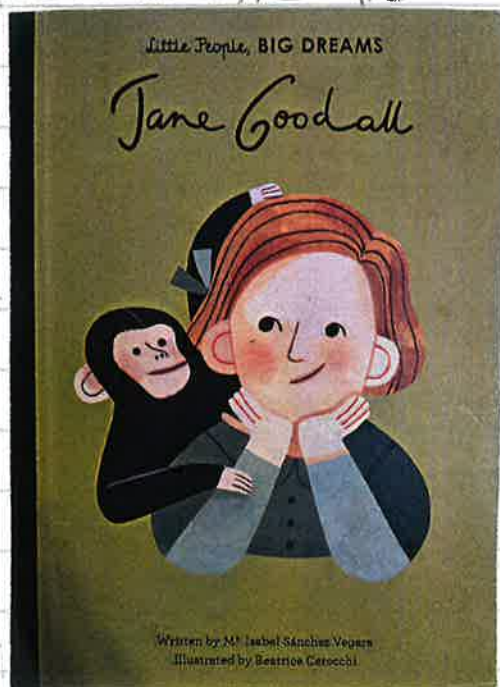


# Jane Goodall
