

Have a quick check in school bags if you haven't already been handed the super useful HSFF Events Calendar (also details other school dates) or print out the one on this update.


Please do pop it on your fridge and add the HSFF dates to your online calendar so you don't double book and miss out on the amazing events planned for this year!


