These included measuring the depth and speed of the river at different points, drawing sketch maps of sections of the river and carrying out wildlife surveys. Speaking of wildlife, one of the highlights of the trip was when a family of swans swam up to the bank and hopped out to see us! Sadly for them, we didn't have any food to give them..! The children had already been learning about river features and processes, like meanders and erosion, and it was lovely to be able to get outside and see it in real life. 




Beech
