

We would like to extend a humongous thank you to everyone involved in the running of the Fayre- we really cannot put on such a large event without the help you gave on the day!


The teachers and teaching assistants, the admin team and Team Spirit and all the parents and children (current and former) who volunteered their time and energy on Saturday.
