#### MOMENTS MATTER, ATTENDANCE COUNTS.





From the first day of term to the last, the small moments in a school day make a real difference to your child. #AttendanceCounts





### The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

- · In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.
  - · And 36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs, also compared with 84% of regular attenders. And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:
- More than half (54%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year II, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.

But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

 Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.

The Southampton ELSA conference was held on Tuesday with almost 100 delegates from across the city and Hamshire attending. The conference was planned and facilitated by the Emotional Development Group – a team of educational psychologists and ELSAs, including Ms Lewis and Mrs Smith! The theme of the conference was "Side-by-side: Travelling together" with three workshops to help explore what and how we 'think, feel and do' when working 'side by side' in all things emotional literacy including a keynote speech and workshop run by Andrew Moffat, founder of No Outsiders.

Ms Lewis was lucky enough to help facilitate the "Do" workshop – Hearing their stories: exploring methods and materials that help us connect, understand and support our young people. Ms Lewis said it was great to network with so many professionals from across the city and share the good practice that we have here at Highfield School.


