

Curriculum

Mr Dodson spent time looking at our system for tracking outcomes in foundation subjects (e.g. art, DT, history). We are working to ensure that our system captures the skills and knowledge of the curriculum and the most effective methods to do this meaningfully.

This week we have been reflecting on our school value of Courage. We heard the story of Queen Esther in the Bible who showed courage by breaking the rules and putting herself in danger in order to save her people. We then discussed this picture, and what it tells us about Courage. The children had the opportunity to write their fears on a post-it note, which will be burnt in our fire pit on Friday!



Parent Forum Feedback



Thank you to the group of parents who attended the parent forum this afternoon.

The main areas we covered included:

- When is the multiplication check for year 4? The MTC is taking place the week commencing June 3rd.
- Can children practice key skills at school before or after school? We will continue to look into it.
- Books in English can we have more female leads in the books that are studied in years 5 and 6? Absolutely, we will look into the texts.
- Infants dogs- Not all children like dogs and we would ask that dogs are not tied up near to the entrances of school. We have some pupils who are scared of barking and we ask that they are not tied up and unattended.
- Walking up the hill we discussed the start of the day and how infant children can get quite tired walking to the juniors to drop off siblings. We are looking into how start times could help resolve this.
