Uniform Policy

“Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.” Colossians 3:14 (NRV)

In accordance with Government guidelines, the school has a published school uniform. This can be found on the school website and in the parent handbook.

It is our aim that all children be appropriately dressed for classroom and sports activities, whilst respecting religious and cultural differences.

We do not believe access to the uniform should be a barrier to a child’s access to school and therefore although we are strict on adherence to a dress code we designed this uniform with certain aims in mind.

- We review the providers of our branded items periodically to try to get a balance of best value and convenience for parents;
- We do not enter into “cash back” arrangements although we do allow the HSA to use our school logo on optional branded products which are sold for their fundraising;
- We do not insist that pupils wear expensive items of uniform by seeking to ensure that the majority of the uniform (with exception of branded items) are items regularly found in a wide range of High Street stores or supermarkets;
- We will not make frequent changes to uniform specifications;
- We keep compulsory branded items to a minimum.

Used clothing is available to buy at school fetes and some is held by the school to provide uniform clothing to children as needed.

Related Policies:

Equality and Diversity: School clothing respects religious and cultural differences and allows children to fully participate in all curriculum activities.

Behaviour Policy: Pupils wearing the school uniform can be identified and should reflect the school values.
