


## IN SCHOOL THIS WEEK Year 1/2



## Highfield CE Primary School Big Zig-Zag Banner Competition



Use a blank sheet of A4 paper to do your banner design. Use the whole sheet – work right up to the edges of the paper and use the paper 'Landscape'- (so the sheet of paper is widest from left to right)).

Remember what it is we want to tell drivers. Your design could contain any of these messages.

- It is better for our air quality and our health to 'park and walk' (park at least 500 metres away from the school)
- Walking is good exercise its keeps us healthy and is good for our hearts
- It is not sensible or caring to drive or park in the road directly outside the school
- It is not safe to park in the street outside the school gates as this means its difficult for pupils to
  cross the road
- they must not stop their car on the zig-zag lines
- It is illegal to park or 'stop and drop' on the zigzags
- Use clear messages and bold clear colours and design (felt tips preferably) to make it easier for people to read and understand our message
- Include your name and class number in pencil on the back of your poster
